Since the onset of this virus, we have had 39 resident and 24 staff members test positive for COVID-19. 23 staff members have recovered, and the remaining staff are quarantining at home. We are continuing the process of mass testing of the staff which has been mandated by CMS and HHSC.

As you have probably heard, the CDC announced that healthcare workers and long-term care residents would be among the first group of people to receive the vaccine for COVID-19. We are optimistic this will help stop the spread of this virus in our community. We have had our first and second clinics to administer the vaccine, and we will have our final clinic on February 23, 2021. As we look forward to this, please join us in continuing to do our part in limiting the transmission of COVID-19 by wearing masks, washing your hands and keeping a safe distance from others.

As always, we are working hard to keep everyone in our community safe and we will continue to practice the enhanced safety precautions that are known to prevent the spread of COVID-19, such as only essential personnel are allowed inside the facility and we screen them for signs and symptoms of illness prior to entering. Our residents are continually monitored and staff is using PPE as recommended by the CDC. Staff is frequently reminded and encouraged to practice social distancing and to use hand sanitizer and frequently wash their hands when they are in the facility and out in the community. We ask them not to report to work if they have symptoms of illness.
